

THE NEW PASSENGER AND RO-RO GATEWAY OF NORDIC EUROPE

LLC "Riga Ropax Terminal", over the next 5 years, is developing a new specialised RO-RO/RO-PAX terminal for ferry, ro-ro and cruise ship service in Riga, Latvia. RRT already provides sea passenger services in Riga, with a focus on development of the new Terminal in the near future.

Today the RoPax Terminal project has reached its planning & preparation phase. Our robust business plan, solid operational track-record and strategic support from major stakeholders – Freeport of Riga and Riga Municipality – provides a strong foundation for success. Recently the architectural competition was completed with Zaha Hadid Architects as winners, offering a detail floor-planning approach to the Terminal. RoPax has a secured a memorandums of cooperation with Freeport of Riga and Ports of Stockholm. In-depth market research by Deloitte is readily available. Negotiations with potential ferry line operators are nearing their final stages. Upon The new terminal will become the most efficient and modern RO-RO/RO-PAX terminal in the region.


Snapshot: Historical Port

The Future of Riga's Maritime Travel

The new Riga Ropax Terminal will enhance country's maritime transportation capabilities and help to boost economic growth in the region. The project developers are in active and close cooperation with the Riga City Council and Riga Freeport Authority; the public partners are on board with the project. Local plan of the territory is in the process of approval by Riga Municipality. Riga Ropax Terminal team is also working closely with the Port of Stockholm to explore possibilities for restoring maritime traffic between Riga and Stockholm and joint participation in EU funding projects.

Riga is becoming an increasingly attractive destination for sea passengers. The new terminal could welcome around 1,1 milion of them after 1st full year of operation.
